Soprano Rosa Lamoreaux is known for her flawless sense of style, incandescent presence, "a wonderfully rich timbre and an amazingly flexible voice" (Washington Post). She has been hailed for her versatile musicianship, her radiant, engaging, and effortless singing. An award-winning vocalist, Ms. Lamoreaux is sought after for her beautifully styled readings of repertoire from Hildegard to Shostakovich. Lamoreaux's extensive discography includes recordings for Dorian (Bach B Minor Mass) and Koch (Hildegard, French Renaissance Theatre, and many more). Her latest releases are Evening Serenade, featuring works from the Baroque to the Romantic, and Oh, So Nice a collection of standards and more from Gershwin and Berlin to Bernstein and beyond.

After winning the Handel Aria Competition at the Aspen Music Festival and an honor as finalist in the Oratorio Society Competition of New York, her career has taken her to Carnegie Hall, the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion and

the Kennedy Center. She has won critical acclaim for her performances at Bach festivals in both the United States and Europe. Among her many symphony engagements, she has been soloist with the Atlanta Symphony and the Cincinnati Symphony in performances of the Bach B minor Mass and Mozart's Mass in C minor. A perennial favorite, Lamoreaux has appeared numerous times with the National Philharmonic Orchestra in repertoire as varied as Debussy's *Martyrdom of St. Sebastian* (for which she also took the narrator's role, in French) and the premiere of Janice Hamer's opera *Lost Childhood*.

A popular chamber music performer, she sings with the Folger Consort, Vocal Arts Quartet, ArcoVoce and Hesperus, and she has toured with Musicians from Marlboro. Her many engagements include performances at the Library of Congress, the Smithsonian, National Gallery of Art, Corcoran Gallery, the Washington National Cathedral and at the Cloisters and the Chautauqua Institute in New York. In Europe she has appeared at the Proms at the Royal Albert Hall, and at the Rheingau Music Festival, La Fenice Chamber Music Festival, Scandinavian Music Festival, at the Louvre and Belvedere Schloss among other distinguished venues. Recently, Ms. Lamoreaux has made two South American tours with Hesperus.

Ms. Lamoreaux enjoys teaching and has given master-classes for such institutions as Princeton University, Michigan State and the Smithsonian Institution.
